How many of your areas of identity are affirmed and validated by society? (your peers, family, society, institutions...)

Well intentioned folks will often unintentionally negate the identity of others:

"I don't see difference"

"I don't see skin colour or race"

"I don't see gender"

"I don't see sexual orientation"

"All people are just people"

"We are all the same inside"

"We are just one human race"

"Everyone is the same"

Sameness is a DANGEROUS message!

The more marginalized, the more important identity becomes!

"ALL LIVES MATTER"

"Women's Lives Matter"

"Gay Lives Matter"


"Trans Lives Matter"

"Poor Lives Matter"


"Asian Lives Matter"



Pedagogical Shift in Anti-Oppression Work

- *We used to place the onus for anti-oppression work in the hands of those who are oppressed:
 - *Women fighting for women's rights
 - *Poor fighting poverty
 - *Racialized fighting for civil rights
 - *LGBTQ fighting for gay/trans rights
- *An archaic system of putting social activism in the hands of those who are oppressed themselves.

NEW APPROACH

Ally Capacity Building

Put the onus for anti-oppression work in the hands of those who have the power to make the necessary changes.

Requires a sound knowledge and ownership of one's own

PRIVILEGE

Privilege = Power

Power = Change

By recognizing and embracing your own position of privilege... one can move towards **ally** capacity and be a part of true systemic change!

OWNING ONE'S PRIVILEGE

- Our goal is to move towards ally capacity
- NOT feeling guilt or becoming defensive about our privilege
- NOR is the goal about giving up our positions of power... but rather using it to move towards equity and inclusivity

• **Privilege:** unearned positions of advantage.


- Usually at birth
- Changes with time and place
- Intersectional or layered
- Often based on perception (how others see you)
